

What I Need to Know

Naming of New Appliances

- The distinguished service of brigade members may be recognised by having new fire appliances named in their honour. The individuals may be either past or present members. The Assistant Commissioner, Rural Operations, makes the final decision regarding the naming of an appliance. An appliance may be named for many reasons, such as:
 - a mark of respect to one who has died in the line of duty;
 - recognition of extreme courage or brave conduct;
 - recognition of distinguished service;
 - an especially distinguished record of fire service or particular service of conspicuous merit.

How I do it

- Contact your Area Director, Rural Operations, outlining the request to name an appliance in honour of an individual.
- You will need to include in your request the name of the person and the reasons for the request.
- The Area Director, Rural Operations, will notify the Brigade as to whether the request has been approved by the Assistant Commissioner, Rural Operations.
